Under the order, the minimum prices of butter increase to a top, reached in October, of 32 cents a pound for British Columbia and Eastern Provinces, 30 cents in Alberta and Manitoba, and 29 cents in Saskatchewan.

The order explained that prices two cents per pound lower than in British Columbia and eastern provinces were fixed for Alberta and Manitoba and three cents a pound lower for Saskatchewan because these "three provinces are exporting provinces and the differentials provided are based on existing freight rates to the principal markets of the exporting provinces."

The order provided for a minimum differential between solids and prints of one cent a pound. It said the prices were on a basis of "delivered to the purchaser," and it was felt this was the only way in which fair competition in selling could be secured.

The board also expressed belief that increases in the fixed minimum price throughout the production season would induce trading and support of the market "by those who ordinarily store butter."
