Timmins High and Vocational School athletes dominated the northern district Northern Ontario Secondary Schools Association track and field meet in Timmins on Monday afternoon.

Timmins athletes managed to set three new meet records, Kirkland Lake one and South Porcupine one. M. Burnette of Timmins set a new mark of ten feet, ten inches for the senior pole vault.
