Picture Injects New Life and Meaning Into Screen-Thriller

The "chase" has long been a favourite method of highlighting motion pictures, but it remained for 20th Century-Fox to inject new life and meaning into the "chase" in its latest thriller, "Man Hunt," starring Walter Pidgeon and Joan Bennett at the Palace theatre, Friday and Saturday, Sept. 26th and 27th.

To start with, Geoffrey Household's book, "Rogue Mac," on which the picture is based, put the studio about twenty strides ahead of the field. Pre-eminently an adventure story, with a new and different "chase" theme, its dramatic impact made it a best-seller on two continents.

Dudley Nichols' script, which took months to complete, was hailed as even better and more exciting than the novel—for Nichols sensed the movie value of the theme and pointed up those portions which were "naturals" for the screen.

Walter Pidgeon considers his "Man Hunt" role his finest. Vigorous and exciting, he is on the quarry end of the longest "chase" in film history. From the Bavarian Alps to the North Sea, across the channel to England, from London into the British countryside the relentless hunter—George Sanders at his best—stalks Pidgeon. And Pidgeon revels in it; says its a role he can really sink his teeth into.

Unquestionably this is also one of the best roles in the glamorous career of beautiful Joan Bennett, who as the "girl out of the shadows," dons her familiar sophistication and appears as an elemental woman fighting single-handed against tremendous odds for the man she loves. How well she succeeds is indicated by the reports that "Man Hunt" opens a new series of roles for her.

Fritz Lang, whose forte is adventure films as his "Western Union" and "Return of Frank James" attest, was selected to megaphone "Man Hunt." His ideas on the "chase" contained within the film heighten the mood and the excitement, and his first hand knowledge of the European background of the picture do much to enhance its many gripping scenes.

John Carradine and Roddy McDowell, who complete the outstanding featured cast, add immeasurably to the dramatic value of "Man Hunt."
