In the second period the Dome tried to stage a comeback and at the start it looked as though it would be successful but after the halfway mark the Bisons sewed them up.

Near the halfway mark in the second period Gordon started a few plays of his own and it brought results. At the eleven minute mark he scored his first goal on a pass from Ladds when the two of them worked in close on Kemp.

For practically all of the last period the Dome kept attacking relentlessly but they were unable to score and Kemp was called upon to make a great many sensational stops.

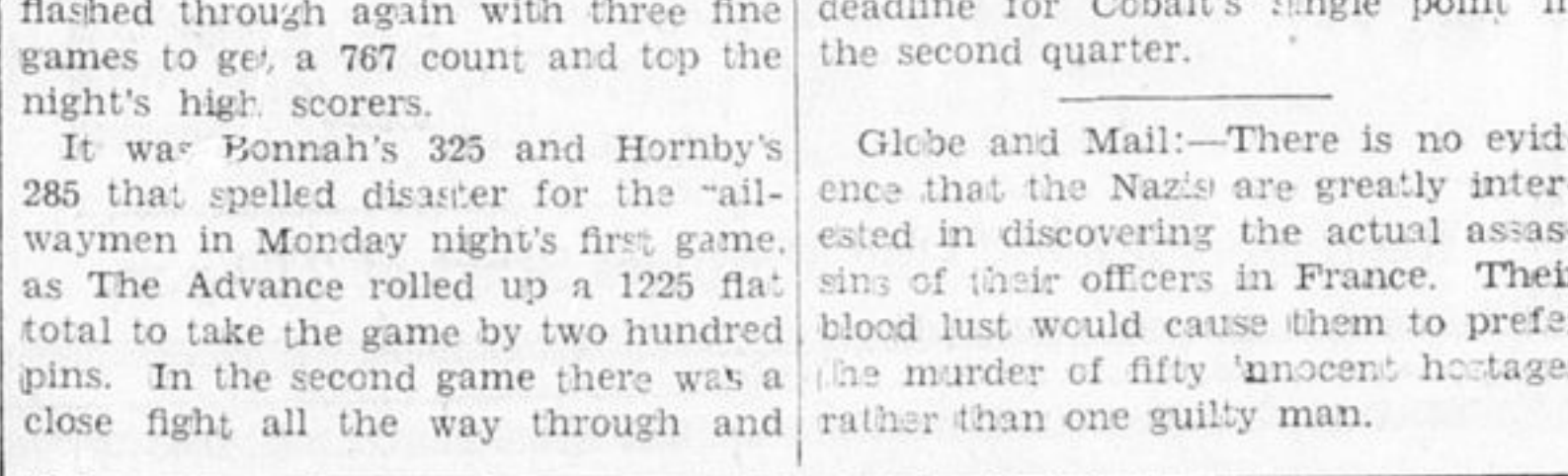
North Bay scored five touchdowns against Cobalt and converted three of them and then gained single points on a ruge and a kick to the deadline.
