Ladies' Auxiliary Packs Twenty More Parcels This Week

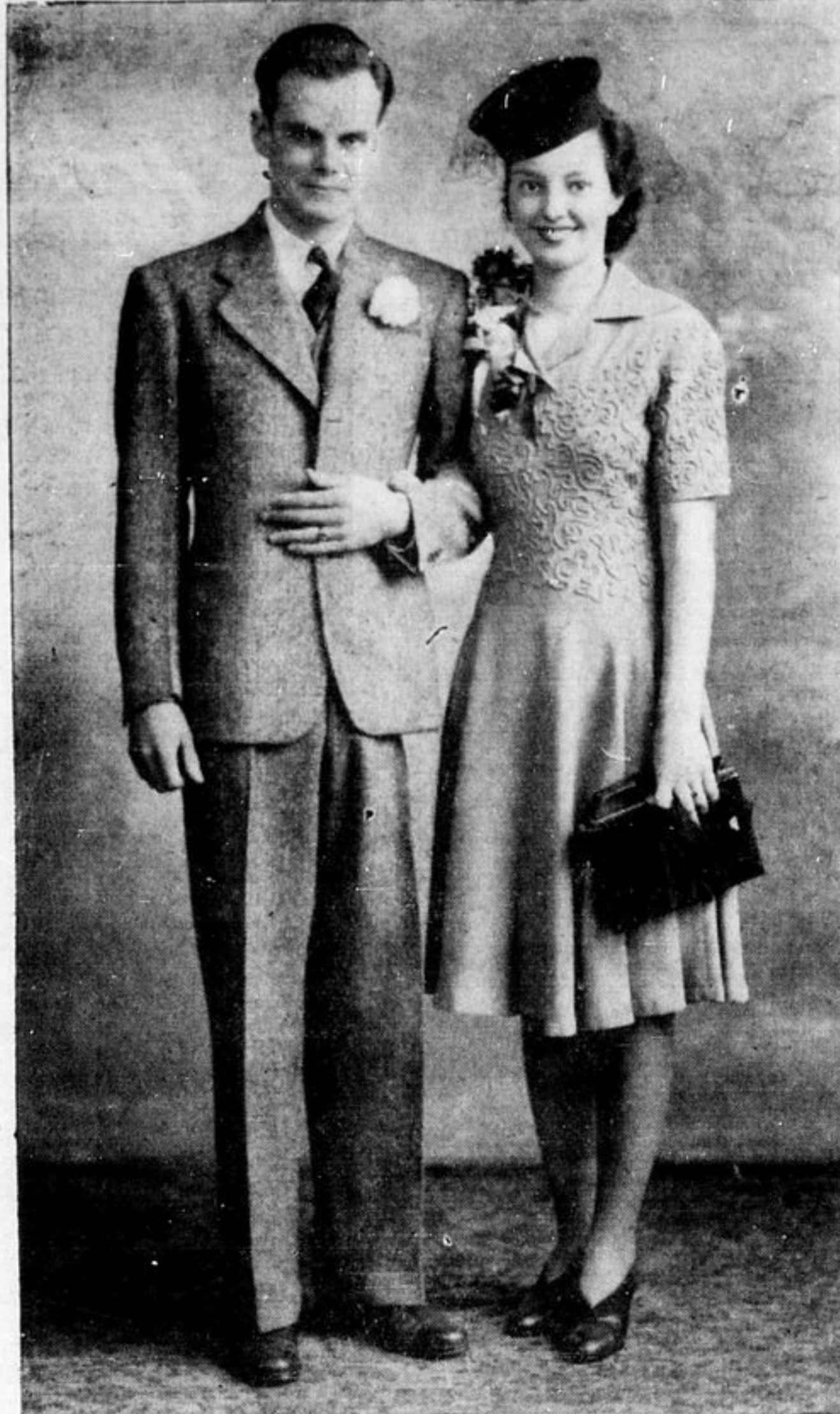
Total of Three Hundred and Fifty-Two Parcels Has Been Sent by Members to Men on Active Service.
