Photography:—There are, perhaps, more cameras per capita in Timmins than in any similar-sized town in the Dominion. Timmins has more than its share of very skilled amateur photographers, some of them here and in Schumacher and South Porcupine being so outstanding as to rank with the best professionals.

Musical:—Citizens' Band, Lions Boys' Band, Gold Belt Band, McIntyre Concert Band, Pipe Band, Schubert Choral Society, Cornish and Welsh Choirs, first-class orchestras, music studios, dancing classes, etc. The Music Festival held at Timmins this year brought together a notable array of talent, not only from Timmins, but from a wide district including Kapuskasing, Smooth Rock Falls, South Porcupine and Schumacher, etc. Still more extended plans are being made for the event next year.

The National Festival, presenting the music, costumes, customs, etc., of the many nationalities that have helped to build this part of the North was a notable even in 1939. Last year, eleven National Groups entered the Festival. This year on account of war conditions the Festival was deferred, but will be resumed as soon as conditions warrant.

Timmins Remembers the Men On Service at Christmas

All through the year, the Red Cross, the Women's Institute, The Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire, the Salvation Army Red Shield, the Legion, the Ladies' Auxiliary, and numerous others, in Timmins and district have devoted hours, days, and weeks to work for the soldiers, sailors, and men of the Air Force, in knitting, sewing, making bandages, and sending parcels of foods and other necessities and special "treats" from home. The members of all service clubs in the district have done everything possible to help in the one thought that is uppermost in the minds of all Canadians, this war must be won. At the Christmas season, each year, these clubs go beyond their normal capacity of work, and add to their quota with extra Christmas gifts to the men on active service, to former members, to relatives and friends, and to men of this district who may be without other parcels. No one is forgotten, and each club co-operates in the work.

An example of what some of the clubs are doing this Christmas of 1941, is contained in the following lines.

The Kinettes, besides their regular work for the sailors of the Thornwick Bay, sent these men twelve boxes of Christmas specials, containing one hundred and twenty pounds of wearables and eatables.

The Easy Aces Club held a dance and donated the proceeds to the sending of three hundred cigarettes to one hundred and ten men from this district now on active service.

The Women's Institute, which regularly cares for the needs of the sailors on the ship "Gaspe," sent out twenty-two extra parcels for the relatives and friends of members in service in Canada. Many other parcels were sent overseas, and on Friday the members packed further gifts for the sailors of the Gaspe.

The War Beavers donated their funds to the sending of cigarettes to forty soldiers.

The Salvation Army Red Shield continued its great work with extra Christmas parcels.

The Eastern Star members, who knit regularly for the Red Cross, made hampers for the needy, packing them with the many necessities and a few luxuries.

Grade VII pupils of St. Anthony's School sent fourteen thousand cigarettes to former pupils in the services, while Mattagami school repeated their performance of last year with cigarettes to former pupils.

The Ladies' Auxiliary of the Canadian Legion, whose work is well-known among the enlisted men from this district, sent parcels to every man from the district; the Legion sent Christmas gifts of cigarettes.

The Past Grands Club of the Rebekahs packed fifteen Christmas parcels, while the knitting club of the same organization sent ten parcels to relatives of the members.

The "Dime Club" sent extra Christmas work on to the I.O.D.E. for mailing, and the I.O.D.E. contributed their share to these parcels.

The Cornish Social Club sent cigarettes to men overseas and in Canada.

The C.W.L. (Catholic Women's League) made ditty bags for the men of the navy.

The Lions Club sent cigarettes to four former members, Maurice Belanger, Ray Hughes, Keith Stirling, and Bill Wren.

The Kiwanis and Kinsmen clubs, along with many other organizations of the town, donated to the Christmas tree for children of soldiers held on Friday evening, and the latter organization also donated to the Children's Shelter, and sent cigarettes to men on active service.

Into each parcel, into each package, and into each donation, besides the usual contents, went the good wishes of the people of the district, the hopes that another Christmas will find peace, and find the men on service back in their homes, and the "daddies" ready to make their own children's Christmas trees.

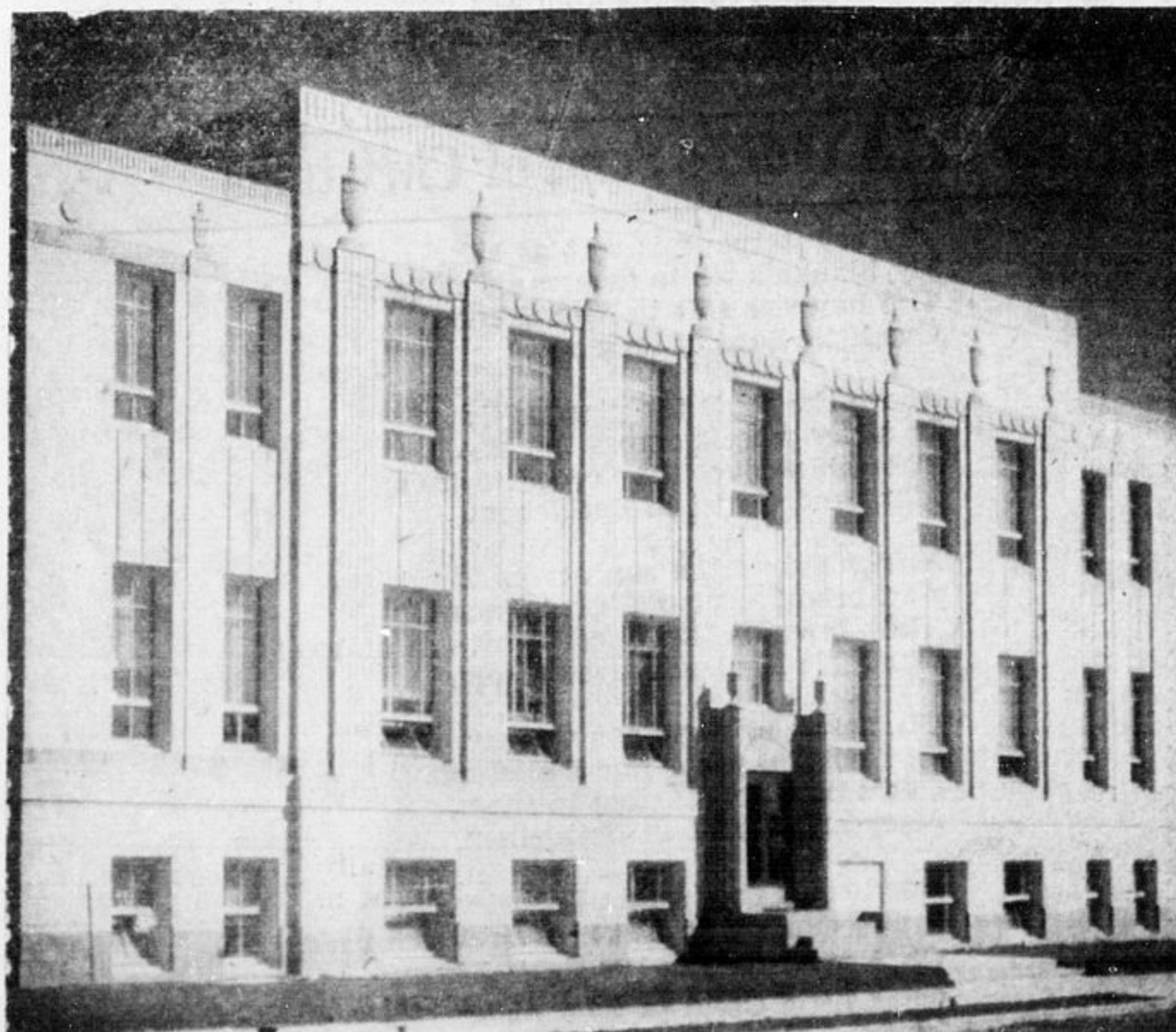
