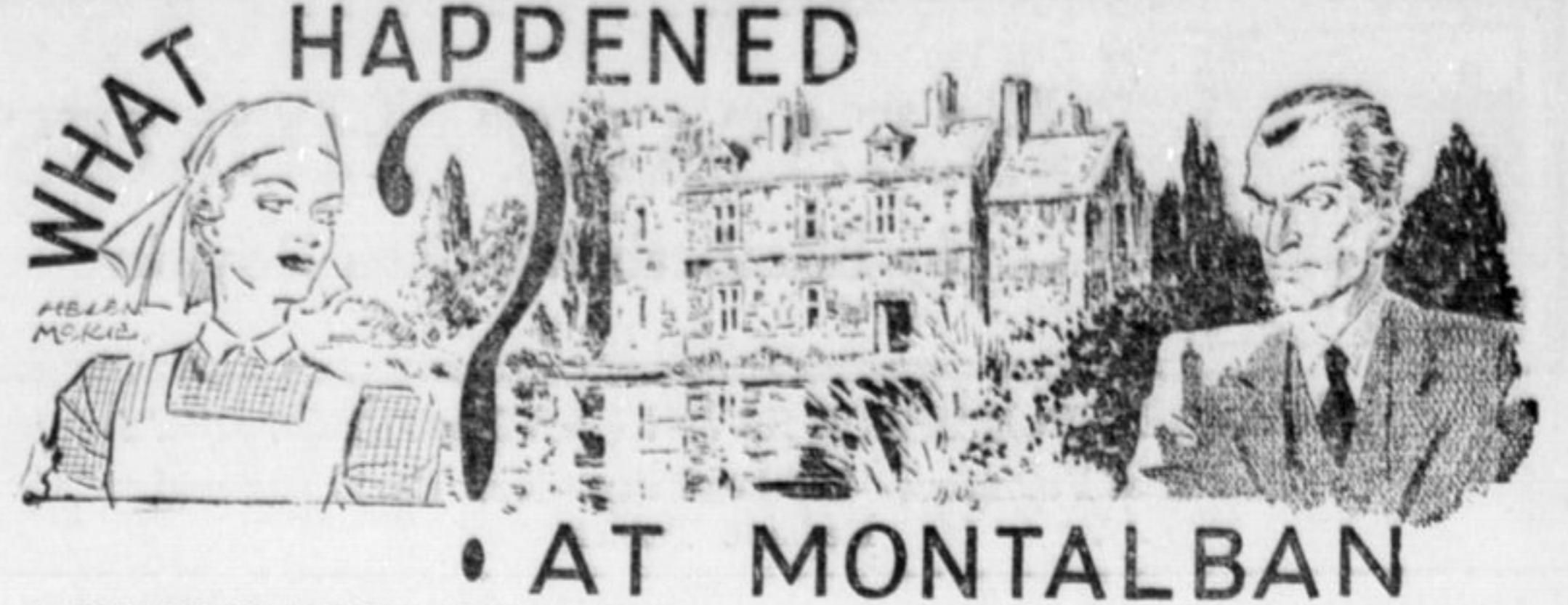

TOWN OF TIMMINS DISCOUNT For Prepayment of Taxes
