

# Buffalo-Ankerite Takes Title With Shut-Out

## Hollinger Win From Ankerite on Friday as They Play a New Brand of Defensive Hockey

Hollinger Just Clears the Puck for Last Ten Minutes as They Protected Their One Goal Lead. Win Stretched the Series to Four Games. "Wink" Wilson Scores Winning Marker.

With their backs against the wall and fighting against elimination in the local N.O.H.A. senior finals on Friday night of last week the Hollinger Greenshirts took a four to three verdict over Hobe Esselstine's Buffalo-Ankerite Bisons in the third game of the best of five series. The verdict prolonged the life of the Greenshirts till the Monday night game.

The Greenshirts were desperate when they started the game and right from the first whistle they kept the pressure on till it paid off. Haffidson finally netted the first counter about halfway through the game and then the Greenshirts settled back and lifted the pressure for the rest of the period. In the second period Alex Stewart sent them two ahead but before the period had ended the score was tied again. In the last few seconds of the second period the Greenshirts let out a burst of power that sent them one ahead again.

The third period just got nicely started when the Bisons tied the count again and then a minute later the Greenshirts went into the lead for the last time.

Chuck Jemmett, Hollinger mentor, used some new strategy on Friday night and it worked very nicely. For the last ten minutes of the game he instructed his players to go on an all-out defensive and they did. The Bisons roared into the Hollinger defensive zone time and again but every time the Greenshirts would blast the puck out to the centre zone again and relieve the pressure on Bentley.

The Bisons were strengthened on the defence by the addition of Harold Johnston, former McIntyre defenceman, whom they acquired as a military replacement for Jerry Heibert, who left for the army a couple of weeks ago. The big blonde defenceman showed his worth as he got assist for two of the Ankerite goals and played a real heavy game at the blue line.

"Wink" Wilson showed up well for the Greenshirts again and flashed the red light for the winning marker after going scoreless for the previous game. The line-ups were:

## Ankerite Takes the Second Straight Northern Ontario Title. Shut Out Hollinger

Brownlee Gets Second Shut-Out of the Season in the Deciding Game of Final Series. Ankerite Now Moves South Against the O.H.A. Winners. Bob Young Scores Winning Goal in Second Period.

Displaying the same fighting spirit and dazzling speed that kept them near the top of the heap all through the season, the Hollinger Greenshirts bowed out of the hockey picture for this season on Monday night as they dropped a tough one to nothing decision to the Buffalo-Ankerite Bisons in the fourth of the best of five series for the senior N.O.H.A. championship. The Bisons outscored the Greenshirts but it was the Hollinger team that showed the speed all through the game and though they had a big edge in the play they failed to get their sights lined on the Ankerite goal.

It was a tough decision for the hard-working Greenshirts to lose and a nice one for the Bisons to win. All through the regular season the same two teams dished up the best hockey of the schedule when they clashed and the fans who figured that there would be good competition in the finals didn't guess wrong. In the four games that the two clubs played in the finals there was a difference of only two goals in the total scores and each of games was won by a one-goal margin.

The Greenshirts carried most of the play on Monday night and even in the first two periods when they had only five shots at the Ankerite net they held their own with the Herd in the play. The Hollinger shots weren't going near the goal, though, but were ending up in the corners and they couldn't seem to get a good power attack organized. During one of the penalties the Greenshirts threw on a power attack that kept the puck bottled up in the Ankerite end of the rink for the entire two minutes but they failed to get one shot at the net.
