Why is the Plebiscite Being Held?

Because the Government consider themselves bound by the promise not to send conscripted men overseas, and believe that, under the changed circumstances and in the present desperate situation, they should be relieved from this pledge and placed in a position where they can act promptly to meet an emergency or any new condition that may arise.

What Will a "YES" Vote Accomplish?

A "Yes" majority will leave the Government free to use the conscripted men training in Canada to reinforce and maintain the Armed Forces Overseas if this should become necessary. A "Yes" majority will show that Canada really has heart in the war, and is prepared to play her part in winning Victory for the sake of her own Freedom and that of the Empire and of the other Free Nations

What Will a "YES" Majority Not Do?

It will not necessarily increase the number of men to be conscripted. They are being conscripted and trained now but the Government feels restricted to Home Defence in making use of their services. This involves waste of manpower and money, since recruits for Overseas must be found some way.

It will not rob the farmers of the labour required on their farms, since under the the Selective Service plan men essential to the farms are exempt from the draft.

What a "No" Majority Would Mean?

It would mean that Canada would have to train two sets of men,, one for Overseas and another for Home Defence.

It would mean that the training for Home Defence would be wasted, if circumstances arose where they were not needed here but were needed Overseas.

It would mean that Canada was not all out for Total War.

It would mean that Canada would be humiliated in her own eyes and in the eyes of the world

It would mean that the Berlin radio would send forth a blast of delight and triumph.
