C.W.A.C. Military and Pipe Bands at Unveiling of Township Honour Roll

Impressive Ceremony at South Porcupine on Tuesday Afternoon This Week. Sergt Hulley Reported Slightly Wounded in Action. Other Items of Interest from South Porcupine and the Dome

South Porcupine, July 26th, Special to The Advance.

South Porcupine gave the military and pipe bands of the Canadian Women's Army Corps, which are on a coast to coast recruiting tour, a great welcome on Tuesday afternoon when they paraded to the Township Building. Twenty smart young women comprised the pipe band and thirty were in the brass band. They were applauded for their excellent performances as they played to the large crowd collected before the building. The ceremony of unveiling the Honour Roll for the Township of Tisdale was dignified and impressive. Two large, framed, illuminated, sheets of names of men and women who have enlisted in the armed forces from the Township were conspicuously placed in front of the building covered with a Union Jack. Over nine hundred names are on the roster.

After "O Canada" was given by the brass band, Reeve Victor H. Evans welcomed the visiting C.W.A.C.'s who were placed inside a roped-in enclosure in front of the hall. "We are met today to receive into our community a very worthy organization," said the Reeve, "in the personnel of the C.W.A.C. pipe and army band." In commenting on the high privilege conferred on Tisdale that these ladies should see fit to visit our community, he called it a "unique and epic" event. It is the first time such an organization has visited here and a welcome hand is extended, not only now but in all future occasions. "We hope they will return and will receive a royal welcome at the hands of all citizens. It is fitting that at this time we unveil the Honour Roll of those men and women who have volunteered from this Township to serve their country. Nine hundred men and women are serving from Tisdale. We are proud of them, and we in turn would like you to know we recognize this Honour Roll as a symbol of our responsibility by the Township of Tisdale, to our sons and fathers whose names are set upon this roll. We will accept the responsibility of seeing these men and women rehabilitated after the war." The pipe band gave a marching selection before the Reeve called on Archdeacon Woodall to unveil the Roll and give the dedicatory prayer. "I do here and now dedicate to the glory of God this Roll of Honour in grateful and undying memory of those valiant volunteers of this township who counted not their lives dear unto themselves but have freely offered them in the service of their King and Country," were the words used and the Archdeacon then read a prayer for the safety of the men and women whose names were on the Roll. This was followed by a most impressive rendering of "Abide With Me," given by the military band. A large percentage of the population were present at the ceremony and applause was freely given. After the ceremony the ladies of the C.W.A.C. bands were entertained to afternoon tea at the Airport Hotel, the manager, Mrs. Dalpe, making a most hospitable hostess. The ladies were brought from Schumacher and returned by cars offered by our citizens.
