TEN YEARS AGO IN TIMMINS

From data in the Porcupine Advance Files

Official figures showed that ten years ago the production at the Dome Mine for the previous year was \$47,565 tons milled, the gross recovery being \$7,177,085.00.

The Advance ten years ago had an article dealing with the old-time superstition that it brought ill-luck for women to visit the underground workings of a mine.

Both Timmins town council and the council of the Township of Tisdale ten years ago passed strongly-worded resolutions urging the government to build a road from South Porcupine to Matachewan.

The Timmins Kiwanis Club ten years ago invited the mayor and council to the weekly luncheon of the club at the opening of the council's term.

Considerable space was given in The Advance ten years ago to the annual banquet of the Porcupine Miners Welsh Choir.

For 1935 the Volunteer Firemen elected Alvin Leach as their chairman; J. E. Morrison, secretary-treasurer; and W. Austin and Jack Archer as captain for the year.

About this time of years in 1935, T. H. Wilkes resigned as president of the Iroquois Falls Liberal Association, as a protest against the dismissal by the Hepburn Government of all the staff of the Iroquois Falls liquor store.

Reference was made ten years ago to a visit to town of Rev. James Proudfoot, of the Shantymen's Christian Association, an organization that carried the church to the men employed in the bush and in industry in distant places in this North.

Ten years ago there were four fire alarms in four days with about four dollars damage resulting from all four.

Ten years ago Timmins had lots of snow, though traffic was not stopped or people inconvenienced to any material extent.

Timmins knows how to handle snow. The town, however, had to hire 25 extra men and six extra trucks to look after the one snow storm, while another extra 15 men were taken on by the T. & N. O. Railway at Timmins.

The Advance ten years ago had the following interesting item in the Schumacher news column:—"Born—On Saturday, Jan. 12th, 1935 on the C. N. R. train between North Bay and Pembroke, to Mr. and Mrs. James Brennan, of Schumacher—a son. The mother and baby were taken to the hospital in Pembroke and are reported as doing very nicely."

A public meeting was called in Timmins ten years ago to re-organize a Humane Society in Timmins. Mr. Dave Miller, who came here a short time before from Toronto, occupied the chair.

Ten years ago Mr. W. W. Orr, received word of the death at Toronto of his sister's husband, S. G. White. The late Mr. White was one of the old-time residents of Timmins, being on the electrical staff of the Hollinger in the early days of the town.

Among the local and personal items in The Advance ten years ago were the following:—"Miss Laurel Thrope is spending a week with relatives at Syracuse, N. Y., on her way to Florida."

Last week-end holders of preferred shares of the Northern Canada Power Corporation reviewed the usual quarterly statement, together with the dividend cheques for the quarter ending Dec. 31st, 1944.

In accordance with the announcement made in the press recently, the fixed properties of the Northern Ontario Power Company, Limited, a subsidiary of your Company, were purchased by the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario, as at November 30th, 1944.

Included also is a comparative statement of the earnings of the Canada Northern Power Corporation for the twelve months ending Nov. 30, 1944, and those for the year ending Nov. 30, 1943.

During the same period in 1943, gross earnings were \$4,236,929.32. Purchased power, operating, maintenance and taxes were \$2,075,808.53; the net earnings being \$2,161,120.74.
