Bar to Military Medal Won by C.S.M. E. Knott

Company Sergeant Major Ernest Knott, of Timmins, has won the Bar to the Military Medal which he previously won for gallantry in battle, according to a list appearing in despatches from Ottawa. The citation reads as follows:— "On February 19, 1945, 'A' company of the Royal Hamilton Light Infantry was holding their objective on the feature west of Calcar under extremely heavy enemy fire from mortars and an 88mm gun which was firing directly into the position. ... Company Sergeant Major Knott by his initiative and outstanding bravery set an inspiring example for the entire company and helped to assure the success of the company operation."
