

It is natural, therefore, that the present administration of the preference is coming under close scrutiny, so that action in individual cases, or what may appear to be new develop-

"It appears that the general policy received much discussion and is not The second pic ure on this double- very well understood. Resolutions, such as the attached, are now being received and we feel that some action

"Complaints seem to centre around four main points of policy--The extent to which exceptions to the policy respecting permanent appointments are being made, and the manner in which they occur; The laying off of veterans while civilians are being retained; The process to be adopted in releasing wartime temporaries; The steps to be taken to overcome handicaps due to the veterans' absence from Civil Service employment opportunities, in relation to those who have entered the service during wartime and thus gained an advantage in experience...

The Legion is strongly of the opinion that an early pronouncement with respect to Civil Service policy and Veterans' Preference Administration would settle in the public mind many of the questions raised, and would give men now serving overseas an assurance that their interests are being protected.



'As another illustration there is the area at the end of Bannerman and Middleton Avenues in the Town of Timmins and the area in the Feldman Townsite that is covered by water with Elect New Executive sewers except at a prohibitive cost greater than the value of the land and

"As an example of townsite starting up far from existing municipal service there is the new Empire Townsite which will requite 1600 feet of main sewers and at least 1600 feet of lateral sewers to service a small area and yet The meeting was a real Christmas in between there is an area available for building with sanitary sewers. Closer co-operation between Engineering and Health Departments would avert the mistake of one authority granting a building permit for the erection of a house which upon completion becomes a nuisance from the point of disposal of sewage."

> "From the observations above the Board would like to recommend that:

1. As a starting point the co-operation between the department which issues building permits and the Health Department becomes closer. This could be brought about by the permit issuer getting a report on the property from the Health Department before the permit is issued.

2. A further step in the prevention of nuisances would be for the Water Works Department to receive a report from the Health Department regarding sewage disposal at a property before municipal water supply is installed."


