

Forest Fire Danger Stressed By Speaker At Kiwanis Meeting

The serious loss, not only in money, but in employment and other community welfare, through the effects of forest fires, was graphically portrayed on Monday at the Empire hotel at the weekly luncheon of the Kiwanis Club. Motion pictures and a brief address by D. E. Ness, of the Ontario Department of Lands and Forests, Toronto, gave striking evidence of the injuries arising from such fires, and the need for prevention of such disasters.

One film pictured a thriving community turned into a ghost town

through one of these forest fires, with the consequent loss of homes and employment, as well as the actual loss in money through the destruction of the valuable timber. The picture also showed that destruction of forests injured such industries as the fur trade, the paper and pulp business and other lines.

Methods of locating forest fires, and the ways of fighting them were also depicted by the film. It was clear that once a fire got under way, little could be done, except to curb it to some extent by back-fires and clearances to hold it from further spread.

The film made it plain that the real solution to the forest fire problem was to avoid the fires to the greatest degree possible. This meant that everyone going into the bush must exercise the

greatest care. Matches and cigarette stubs were among the most frequent causes of bush fires, and it was the responsibility of all to see that these dangers are avoided.

In his brief address, Mr. Ness pointed out what the Kiwanis and similar bodies may do to help. People had to realize how easy it is to start these forest fires. Matches and cigarettes should be watched with the greatest care. "Be sure your match is out, before you throw it away!" Mr. Ness advised, also urging the greatest care with cigarettes.

Mr. Ness also pointed out that people camping in the bush should always select a spot near a river or lake for their camp fire. Then, they should be sure that the fire was completely out, before they left. "Use lots of water on

it," he said, "and feel the ashes to make sure that there is no fire left that may be fanned into flame later."

Mr. Ness was introduced by Kiwanian Gordon Irving, and thanked by Kiwanian Earl Barkwell.

A film, illustrating the mischievous antics of three bear cubs, added to the interest of the occasion.

President G. N. Ross announced that next Monday being Dominion Day, and a holiday, the weekly luncheon of the Kiwanis would be held on Tuesday, as customary in such cases.

Chairman Frank Feldman reported for the Agriculture committee.

Kiwanian F. Woodbury gave special "boost" to the Legion's Memorial Building Summer Show, to be at the McIntyre Arena, on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, this week. He said that

the show was an outstanding one, and no one should miss it. In addition, in leading the community singing, Kiwanian Woodbury centred on songs that were old favorites of the soldiers of the Legion, "Tipperary," "Pack Up Your Troubles," and others being featured.

President Ross also read a letter from the Lieutenant-Governor, regarding his official visit to the Timmins club. The Lieutenant-Governor will be here on July 26. It will be a joint meeting of the Timmins and South Porcupine Kiwanis, and will be held at Timmins.
