## Reeve Urges Support For Kiwanis Carnival, Now Open In South Porcupine

### Splendid Record Of Club Reviewed In Plea For Public's Co-operation

The president of the South Porcupine Kiwanis has sent out a letter calling attention to three very important days in community welfare work in South Porcupine this Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

On these days this club is holding a grand carnival was designed to aid in the raising of much needed funds for the purpose of doing community work for children, for veterans and other activities of community service.

This carnival is to be held in the arena and the president, Reeve V. H. Evans, asks all personally to attend. There will be fun and entertainment for all, with assured full value for money plus the knowledge that every cent realized will be used for the benefit of those needing help in the district.

Appended to this letter is a short summary of some of the more important community services carried out by the South Porcupine Kiwanis Club over the past three years.

1. Approximately 10,500 pints of milk given free to school children.
2. Seven children supplied free with glasses.
3. Sixteen children given free appendectomy.
4. A Christmas party held annually for less fortunate children and food clothes and toys to needy families.
5. Approximately \$375 given to needy families and institutions doing work for children.
6. Kiwanis playground operated and maintained.
7. Approximately \$1130 donated to various boy and girl activities.
8. Air Cadets (Squadron) organized and maintained during war years.
9. Boy's Potato Club organized in rural areas of district.
10. Victory gardens organized and maintained which produced \$88,000 worth of produce.
11. Approximately \$700 donated to various military, naval and airforce organizations.
12. Organized and aided in collecting 8000 lbs. of clothing for shipment overseas.
13. Total of nearly \$5,000 was distributed to various organizations and charities during these years.

The president concludes with a personal note: "To maintain these volunteer community services it is necessary that you, a citizen of this community, aid us in our efforts to raise funds."
