Help Wanted For Distribution Of Ration Books

This week Mayor J. E. Brunette gave an urgent call for patriotic women in the Porcupine to volunteer their time in assisting in the distribution of the new ration books. Women, school teachers, housewives, high school students, nurses, are all most urgently needed, as approximately 49,000 ration books must be distributed. The volunteers will work in two groups, one group from 8 o'clock in the morning until 1 o'clock noon, and the other group from 1 o'clock until 6.

At least 100 volunteers are needed and are asked to contact the local ration board, telephone number 2300, or call at the municipal Building and leave their names and choice of working hours.

The distribution will take place on Saturday, September 14, at the Central, Holy Family, Mattagami and Moneta schools.

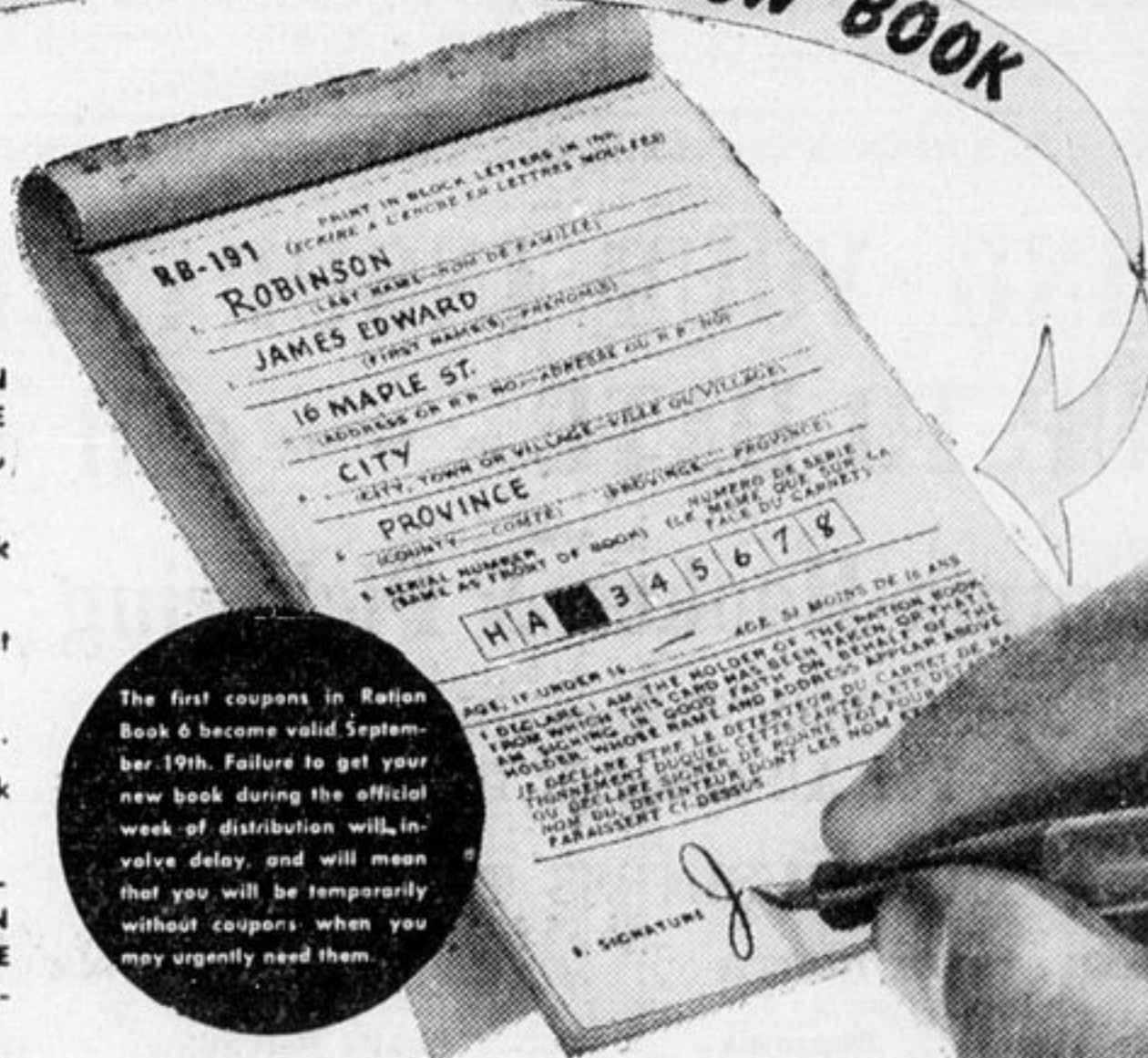
Dote on the different? Make this chair-seat—filet crochet, combined with a pineapple edging. Lovely as a buffet or dresser set too.
