

"Night And Day" Coming To Palace On Sunday Midnite

"Night and Day," starring Cary Grant and Alexis Smith, a top-notch musical film selected by Warner Bros. to celebrate its 20th anniversary, is showing in technicolor at the Palace Theatre, starting Sunday midnight.

The film is the story of the career of one of America's top-flight, song writers, Cole Porter. As such it provides a colorful background for the talents of the stars above named as well as Monty Woolley, Ginny Simms, Jane Wyman, Eve Arden, Carlos Ramirez, Donald Woods and Mary Martin.

The film features a number of Porter's song hits which serve as the basis for a succession of stunning and startling production numbers including the beguiling "Begin the Beguine," "Just Got You Under My Skin," "I Get a Kick Out of You," and "Let's Fall in

Love" which provides the setting for some extraordinarily lovely ballets executed by Milada Mladova and George Zoritch.

The story picks up the life of Porter at that point where he gives up his law studies at Yale to seek his fortune as a song writer and play producer, through his war service (in the First World War), his romance with lovely Linda Lee (Alexis Smith) and his postwar musical success which nearly breaks up his marriage to her.

Broadway Features "Courage Of Lassie"

Lassie, celebrated dog star, whose new adventures take place "The Courage of Lassie" on the Broadway Theatre screen starting on Saturday, has given a new connotation to the title of "Wonder Dog," in sharp contrast to Strongheart, Rin-Tin-Tin, Peter the Great, and the other canine stars of more than a decade ago.

These German shepherd dog actors were made famous by their prodigious feats of strength and stamina, while Lassie has gained renown because of an understanding and personality that border on the human.

The picture, "Lassie Come Home," an honest attempt to understand what goes on within a dog's mind, opened a new era in Hollywood canine films. Man's interest in his best friend, was clearly shown by its success and by the resultant popularity of the four-legged star in the title role. After breaking the opening day records of all but one picture ever to play in New York's Radio City Music Hall, it went on to chalk up new standards all over the English-speaking world.

With "Lassie" are such well-known players as Elizabeth Taylor, Frank Morgan and Tom Drake. The picture is filmed in technicolor.

"Devotion" Shown At Cartier Tonight

For the last times today, "Devotion" is playing at the Cartier this evening. The romantic story of the gifted Bronte sisters -- Charlotte, Emily and Anne -- is told amid the color and gallantry of nineteenth century England.

Charlotte Bronte, played by Olivia de Havilland in the film, achieved unusual success with her novel, "Jane

Nancy Coleman plays Anne, who also was a novelist and poet of some merit.

Paul Henreid has the role of a dashing young curate who becomes involved romantically with both Emily and Charlotte. Sydney Greenstreet and Victor Francen, have leading roles.

Cooper And Bergman Star At Cartier

A fine cast, headed by Gary Cooper and Ingrid Bergman make "Saratoga Trunk," which comes to the Cartier for Monday and Tuesday, a film "which should gain applause from most entertainment seekers.

The film, which captures surprisingly well the flavor of the period, has Miss Bergman as a young woman of the 1870's who sets out to seek revenge against those responsible for the sorrow suffered by her mother in an unconventional romantic adventure. She employs all her tricks and wiles in her efforts to make an advantageous marriage.

From her native New Orleans she goes to Saratoga, where the presence of wealthy society gives her plenty of opportunity to gain her ends. She ties up her fortunes with Gary Cooper, a Texan out to visit his wrath upon the Saratoga Trunk (railroad) operators for bad treatment at the hands of the railroad people back home.

The story is definitely on the light side. Miss Bergman shows a fine flair for humor as the adventuress. Her performance is without a doubt the best thing in the picture.

Barbara Stanwyck Stars At Palace

"The Strange Love of Martha Ivers" starring Barbara Stanwyck, Van Heflin and Elizabeth Scott, and introducing stage star Kirk Douglas, to the screen is now playing at the Palace Theatre.

For adults with a taste for fascinating film-fare, this picture is highly recommended. It is a grimly realistic story of real people, unsavory as they are. It deals with a woman who, as a child, is capable of a bestial murder; of one man too weak to prevent her domination of him; of another man, strong enough to destroy her, but bad enough to stoop to blackmail; and a girl whom life has pushed around, and who shows it. Under Lewis Milestone's effective direction, they enact a tale that packs an unusual wallop from beginning to end.

Zane Grey Western Comes To Cartier

"Wanderer of the Wasteland," from the famed novel by Zane Grey, is scheduled for the Cartier Theatre on Friday and Saturday. It is reported to be a better film than most of its kind, due in part to the author's ability in Western fiction.

James Warren, a young man with plenty of the qualifications required for Western heroics, has the lead role. Richard Martin, in the secondary spot, is a close second for personality. The Grey story, in case you can't remember, concerns a young man who seeks and finds the murderer of his father, but doesn't do what he intend-

ed to do about it when he had set out on the 10-year search.

Added to the program is "Motor Maniacs," a comedy starring Edgar Kennedy, plus Chapter 8 of "Jungle Queen," and news.

Questions and answers

GENERAL

Q What are Canada Savings Bonds?
A Canada Savings Bonds are the successor to Victory Bonds and War Savings Certificates. They are your country's promise to return your money to you at any time and to pay you interest at an attractive rate.

Q Why are Canada Savings Bonds being offered?
A Because during the war, millions of Canadians learned the savings habit by buying Victory Bonds and War Savings Certificates. A recent survey shows that 82% of them want to keep on saving by a similar plan.

Q Is the Government selling Canada Savings Bonds just to raise money?
A No. Borrowing needs of the Government can be met by other types of loans. The main purpose of the Canada Savings Bond is to provide Canadians with a convenient way to continue this kind of saving and investment in peacetime.

Q Is there any limit to the amount of Canada Savings Bonds that one person may hold? If so, why?
A Yes. There is a limit of \$2,000 for each individual, but each member of a family may hold bonds up to the limit.

Q What is the price of Canada Savings Bonds?
A 100%. That is, a \$100 bond costs \$100. If payment is not completed on or before November 15th, 1946, interest will be added to the purchase price.

Q In what denominations are Canada Savings Bonds available?
A \$50, \$100, \$500 and \$1,000.

CASHING OF BONDS

Q Can I cash my bond at any time before November 1, 1956?
A Yes, any branch in Canada of any chartered bank will cash your bond immediately at full face value, plus interest at 2 3/4%, upon your identification as the registered holder.

Q Can Canada Savings Bonds be assigned or transferred?
A They can be cashed, but not assigned or transferred. This is necessary to prevent any individual from acquiring more than the authorized limit.

INTEREST COUPONS

Q What interest is paid on Canada Savings Bonds?
A 2 3/4%—payable yearly on November 1st from 1947 to 1956, by coupon cashable without charge at any branch in Canada of any bank.

Q Are interest coupons registered?
A No. They are payable to bearer.

REGISTRATION PROTECTION

Q Why is it necessary to register Canada Savings Bonds?
A Registration gives protection in case your bond is lost, stolen or destroyed. It is also the simplest way to ensure that individuals do not hold more than the \$2,000 limit.

Q In whose name can Canada Savings Bonds be registered?
A They can be registered only in the name of one individual, adult or minor, up to the amount of the authorized limit.

HOW, WHEN AND WHERE TO BUY

Q Where can I buy Canada Savings Bonds?
A At any branch of a bank or from an authorized investment dealer, stock broker, trust or loan company — or through the payroll savings plan if this is in operation at your place of employment.

Q How do I pay for Canada Savings Bonds?
A In any of the following 3 ways:
1. By payment in full at time of purchase.
2. By monthly instalments through a bank, trust or loan company.
3. By regular deductions from pay, where employers operate the Payroll Savings Plan.
