**First Aid Ambulance Tours North Ontario**

Renewing acquaintance with old friends and classmates in South Porcupine this week was Ray Laforest of Toronto, who accompanied by Bob Hadden also of Toronto is touring the North.

These two young men are students who have taken the Pre-Medical Course at the University and with their first aid ambulance are visiting throughout the North.

These posts are located at strategic points along the main highways. The system, Ray says, is still in its baby stages, next year there will be more points, more ambulances patrolling highways with a three-way radio system in each ambulance with Provincial Police.

This service is sponsored by the Ontario Motor League, the Canadian Red Cross and St. John Ambulance.

These posts are well equipped with first aid supplies sufficient to treat all types of accidents. They are located in places where there are no doctors in the near vicinity. The staff at a post which is usually a service station or garage is well trained in first aid receiving a course each summer. That is what brought these young medical students here.

Courses of five two-hour lectures for a week are given by medical students during the summer.

Instruction is also given to policemen, hydro men, lumbermen, farmers with special courses in artificial respiration given to groups of forty or

fifty children at the beaches and tourist resorts throughout the Province. Ray and the ambulances left on Monday for Ramore where a week's instruction will be given. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Laforest, who were pioneers of South Porcupine and left just a year ago to reside in Mount Dennis, Toronto.
