According to P. J. Whitehead, clerk for the town of Matheson, the records of the year just closed show that there were eighty-six births, twelve deaths and eight marriages.

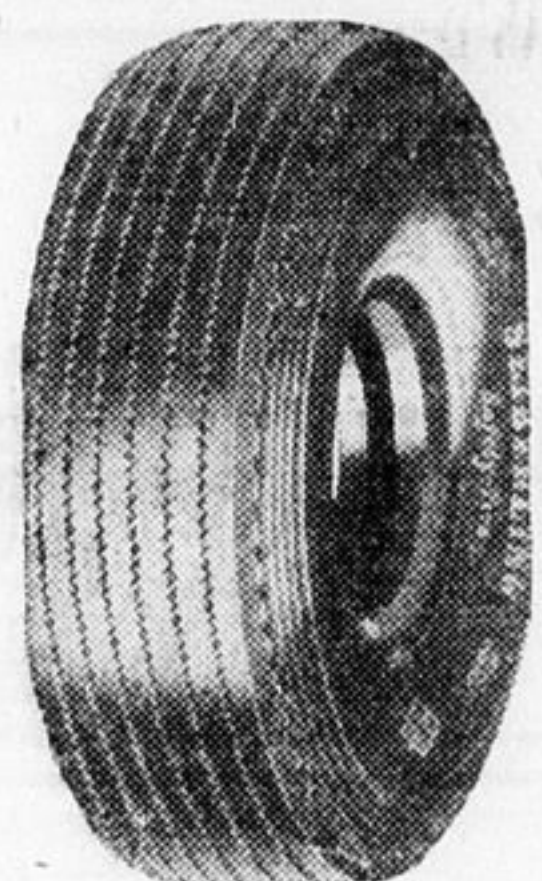
