A Good Pointer On Dyeing Light Hose

If you're like most women, you've got anywhere from two or three to dozens of pairs of light-colored stockings in your bureau drawer, lying idle because fashion dictates deep dark tones.

That's foolish when it's so easy to convert them into the desired shades. The way to do it is to buy a package of jet black all-purpose household dye and go to work.

Pour the dark grains of crystal powder into a wide-mouthed glass jar with a tight screw top. Add 1 1/2 cups of boiling water and stir and shake it well until thoroughly mixed.

Then take your stockings and launder them, rinsing well.

Next, run about a quart of warm water into the basin and add a tablespoon or two of the jet black concentrated dye solution. Swish the stockings around in it a pair or two at a time; squeeze, and swish some more until the stockings are a little darker than you want them to be when dry.

You'll probably find that color tones vary a little, from pair to pair except where you had original pairs of exact duplicates, for your collection no doubt consisted of various different weaves and weights, as well as different color tones.
