L.H. Hanlan Reviews Forage Seed Production

At the recent meeting of the Ontario Improvement Association at Toronto, L. H. Hanlan, of Matheson, Agricultural Representative for this district, presented a paper entitled "Possibilities For Forage Crop Seed Production In Northern Ontario".

Following is the portion of Mr Hanlans paper which dealt with conditions in the districts of Cochrane and Temiskaming:

Cochrane is the most recent district to be developed agriculturally. There has always been a good deany surplus hay that has been produced. There is also a need for quite a lot of fluid milk in the mining and pulp mill centres. Because of these, and perhaps for others reasons, the production of forage crop seeds has like a large scale. In fact this branch of crop production has never been




