Lovely Jean Dickenson "Northern Challenge" An Interesting To Appear Here In April Film Showing Beauties Of District

"Nightingale of the Airways", to millions throughout the United States and Canada, means - JEAN DICKENSON.

For more than six years this vivid young American soprano, who will be heard here on April 21 at the Palace Theatre has been a bright star of radio's perennially popular program, "The American Album of Familiar Music". Each Sunday evening she keeps a rendezvous with music lovers from Maine to California. But she does not confine her activities to the air waves. Jean Dickenson is equally well known, equally admired in the opera house and on the concert stage. In the last two years she has had over a hundred appearances in recital and the demand for her grows as press reports and word of her charm and beautiful voice spread.

The attractive coloratura soprano was born in Montreal. Her father's work as a mining engineer took the family into British India, South Africa, Europe and finally back to America. They settled in Denver, Colorado when Jean was fourteen. She had always studied piano, but it was here that she took her first singing lesson. She quickly impressed her teachers, both by her musical intelligence and by the brilliant promise of her voice.

Upon graduating, Jean appeared as guest artist in New York on several commercial hours and then flew to California to sing on the "Hollywood H. Tel" radio show. After completing her series there, she returned to New York and soon after joined the "American Album of Familiar Music".

From then on, her other activities rapidly increased. The call for her in concert began to multiply to increase. She made her debut at the Metropolitan Opera as Phyllis in "Mignon". She has sung with symphony orchestras throughout the Eastern United States and Canada. Her present season is

the Lamont School of Music. During this time NBC featured her on a weekly coast to coast program from KOA, Denver, called "Golden Melodies".

heavily booked and she travels as far as time between her weekly broadcasts permits.

Each appearance emphasizes Jean Dickenson's right to a place among the front rank young artists in this country. She is not only moving up the ladder of success but is taking the rungs two at a time.

A special and unusually interesting feature at the weekly luncheon of the Timmins Kiwanis Club on Monday at the Empire hotel was the showing of the Ontario Northland Railway's film, "Northern Challenge." This picture is perhaps the best ever filmed of the North Land, and the most comprehensive. It covers the territory adjacent to the O. N. R., from North Bay to Mooseport and Moose Factory.

"Not only are the industries and the fish and game resources effectively dealt with, but the various progressive committees of the North are shown North Bay, Temagami, Cobalt, Halleybury, New Liskeard, Timmins, Swastika, Kirkland Lake, Uchiara and Mooseonee are given attention. The golf course at Timmins and the McIntyre Arena are among the specials shown in the film.

In "Northern Challenge" the extent of Abitibi Pulp and Paper Co. operations are suggested, while other views imply the importance of the forest industries. The extent of mining operations in the North Land are also indicated by the pictures shown. Many interesting facts and figures in regard to mining are also cleverly explained by the narrator.

The film does not forget its sponsor, The Ontario Northland Railway. The film refers to the work of the modern O. N. R. shops at North Bay where equipment is kept in repair and modernized. An interesting sidelight in this connection is the announcement in the film that the O. N. R. cafe car was the first of its kind used on any railway, and that it was designed and constructed throughout at the O. N. R. shops.

"Northern Challenge" is in technicolor, and this added to the effectiveness of the scenes of beauty, the pic-

tures of industries, and the views of progressive towns of the North.

There are many views of Ontario Northland Railway equipment and services, also pictures in-motion of the boat service conducted by the O. N. R. Deputy Fire Chief Jas. Morton operated the film machine, and in expressing the club's appreciation of the film, President Barney Quinn thanked Deputy Chief Morton for his good work.

Visitors for the day were introduced by vice-president P. A. Woodbury, and Deputy Fire Chief Jas. Morton, and Jack Byrum, secretary of Timmins Branch of the Legion.

H. G. Laidlaw reported on the recent trip to Kirkland Lake to compete for the Karl Eyré Kiwanis curling trophy. Over 3,000 letters were sent out in

connection with the Easter Seals campaign for the Crippled Children's fund.

Chairman A. G. Irving reported, adding the fact that \$1,065.00 had been subscribed to this worthy cause to date. Chairman G. N. Ross, reporting for the Achievements committee, pointed out that for February the club had made 724 for club reports to headquarters, the highest ever made by the Timmins club, exceeding the previous record of 679 made in January.
