A Progressive Conservative Executive meeting was held Saturday afternoon April 24, at the Oddfellows Hall, Matheson. The meeting was well attended and opened with the singing of "O Canada". W. R. Thompson of Swastika presided, with the Secretary, Don Frisby of Kirkland Lake.
Two Cabinet Ministers were present, Provincial Secretary the Hon. D. R. Michener and the Hon. Arthur Welsh, Minister of Travel and Publicity and Vice Chairman of the Ontario Northern Railway. Also present was the Dominion Organizer of the Progressive Conservative Association, Mr. Bell. Many of the formalities were dispensed with by the motion so that matters of importance could be dealt with, and to allow more time for the guest speakers.
One motion passed of particular interest was that each branch could have at least four votes namely, president, Secretary and two executive members. The election of officers resulted as follows:
Honorary Presidents — Hon. J. Braeken and Hon. George Drew, President, Donald Grisby of Kirkland Lake; Vice President, Frank McDowell, Timmins; 2nd Vice President, Howard Hill, Iroquois Falls; 3rd Vice President, Alex Perron, Kirkland Lake; 4th Vice President, Percy Boyce, Schumacher; 5th Vice President, George Jacobs, Shillington; 6th Vice President, Mrs. Leo Charlebois, Timmins, representing the ladies of the riding; 7th Vice President, Adolph Des Roches, Timmins; 8th Vice President, Charles Kemsley, South Porcupine; 9th Vice President, Bill Redmond of Kirkland Lake representing the young Progressive Conservatives. Jack Perry of Kirkland Lake was elected Secretary-Treasurer.
Hon. D. R. Michener, Provincial Secretary addressed the meeting.

Hydro power was discussed and a letter from Mr. Hepburn head stating there was no further need for extra power.
"This government is going to meet the ever increasing demand placed on Hydro Electric Power," he said. "Our survey in forestry has never before been equaled. There have been two new townships and paper mills almost completed in Marathon and Torrence. We have restricted the shipping of pulp across the border so that eventually the U.S.A. will be able to look after themselves. Agriculture has been satisfactory. Gold mines have been assisted; highway construction and surfacing has been done."
Hon. Arthur Welsh, Vice Chairman of the O.N.R. and Minister of Travel and Publicity spoke briefly, stating that last year over five million motor cars crossed the border into Canada. "This helps build up the present splendid relationship that exists between the Americans and Canadians today," he said.

The Dominion Organizer of the Progressive Conservative party, Mr. Bell, gave a short but forceful address before the conclusion of the meeting.

NEWS FROM COCHRANE

The death occurred suddenly on Friday of Peter Diamond of Lowbush and Stinson Diamond. He was sixty-one years of age and was one of the first pioneers of the district, having lived well over thirty-five years in this part of the North.

Mr. Diamond had been ill only five days and the coroner's inquest held at Iroquois Falls said that the deceased had died of pneumonia in the bush.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Peter Diamond, Jimmy, David and Philip, three older sons by a previous marriage, and five younger children. Father A. Cournoyer officiated at the ceremony and the services were held in the Church of Transfiguration in Cochrane. Burial was in the Roman Catholic Cemetery.

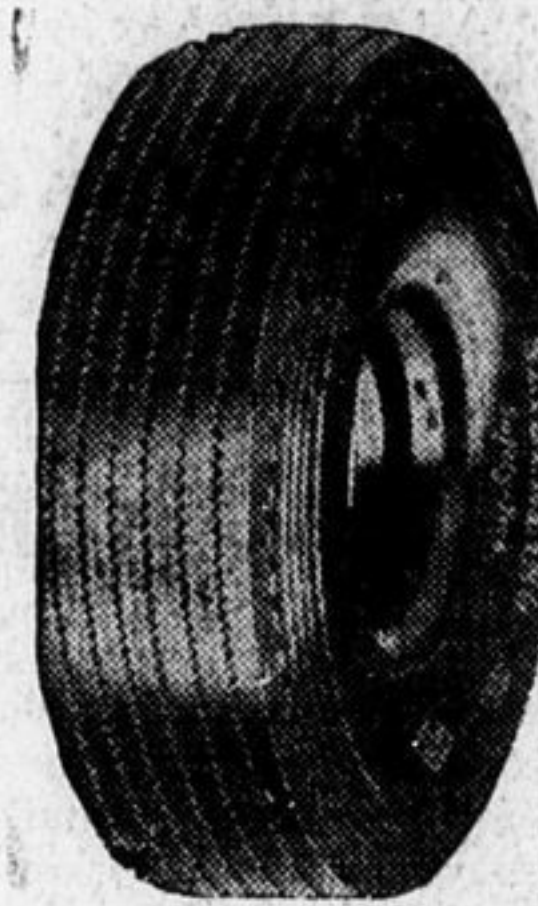
Dr. Rossman Gives Talk At Kinsmen Meeting
