## News From SOUTH PORCUPINE

### Police Court

Steve Kuchera arraigned on two charges of theft of gold ore, and illegal possession of gold ore was sentenced by Magistrate Atkinson to six months in Montelth jail on each count, sentences to run concurrently.

Mr. Platou defended Kuchera.

Constable Withrow of the Dome testified that he found, in a package left with Kuchera's clothing, a little package of gold ore.

When confronted by the Constable, defendant acknowledged his guilt, was quite excited and said it was the first time he had stolen gold. Withrow contacted Constable Johnson of the "Gold Squad" who searched Kuchera's room in the Dome bunkhouse finding two pieces of ore which were said to be from Buffalo-Ankerite "given" to Kuchera and upon searching the closet found a package bound in a sock and hidden in a high boot containing gold ore.

Kuchera acknowledged taking this also. Assver Firth of the McIntyre gave evidence that the gold content was valued at \$74.18.

Mr. Platou pleaded that the man's good record heretofore and no concealment of guilt, and with frankness concerning his theft, should receive consideration and asked for leniency.

Kuchera was unmarried but has two nieces from the old country (D.P.'s) in the camp.

Crown Attorney (acting) Yates contended that while having no record, defendant was "not so entirely innocent" and the above verdict was returned.

A very long discussion brought about by a charge of theft against Jalmar Waino preferred by A. C. White Lumber Co., resulted in dismissal of defendant.

The theft of lumber, doors, logs etc., from a camp belonging to the White Company, and the finding of similar logs etc. at the farm of Waino in Shaw township, was not sufficient evidence of theft. Wm. Capyk who is a son-in-law of Mrs. Rintamaki owner of the farm worked by Waino, gave evidence that he had taken out to the

H. Beland and J. Kosola were each fined \$10 and costs for "taking fish other than angling".

George Tomac was fined \$10 and costs for carrying an unregistered gun.

A. Larable and M. Vaino paid \$10 and costs for overloading.

Leo P. Lalonde, C C F Provincial Council Member for Timmins Riding, at a meeting of the Timmins C C F Club executive Tuesday night moved a resolution emphatically re-affirming complete rejection of L P P support in his or any other riding.

"There can be no collaboration between the CCF and the LPP because of our fundamental differences. We in the CCF believe in a democratic, self-imposed discipline springing out of the decency and intelligence of the common man. Dictatorship in any form, however rationalized, however justified by unscrupulous operators, is repugnant of the CCF philosophy."

Continuing he said: "I might point out that we can no more control the actions of individual Communists than we can the actions of individual Conservatives. You will recall that in the last federal election the LPP, or Communist supported the Liberal party while in recent provincial elections the LPP supported the Conservative party in Ontario and the Social Credit party in Alberta. Tim Buck himself told the people in Alberta to vote Social Credit, rather than vote CCF. We repeat, most energetically and emphatically, that we reject any and all offers of collaboration from the Communist party."

"The Ontario Federation left us with the impression that they mean business," he said. "They are determined not only to defeat the Tory government, but to elect the CCF on the basis of its program. Every step is being taken to co-ordinate the Ontario Federation of Labor and CCF election campaigns."

"In this election the issues will be clear. The CCF first-term program can be summed up in the words people, fish, health, housing and security for all!"

"There is a tremendous feeling in the air down south," he said, "It reminded me of the enthusiasm of 1943 when the CCF came within an inch of taking power. This time the CCF is going over the top."
