**J. E. Schneider Honoured**  
Mr. Jack Emil Schneider of South Porcupine who resides with his daughter Eileen (Mrs. Chas. Laamaren) on Moore street South Porcupine was honoured on his 70th birthday at the home of the Rev. A. L. Heinen, Finnish minister at 53 Rea street South Timmins, on Sunday last, and was presented with a gold watch from his many friends.

This was in connection with a special service in honor of the Finnish and Scandinavian pioneers of the Golden Area of Northern Ontario.

In the course of his sermon the Minister referred to 1912 and 1913 when Christian Church work was started among the New Canadians of Finnish and Scandinavian origin all over Northern Ontario, including Cobalt, Porcupine, South Porcupine, Schumacher, and Timmins by their present minister who has served and is now serving three generations of these people.

After the service the watch was presented to Mr. Schneider (one of the original Finnish "old-timers").

Mrs. Hannah Schneider, who has been dead now for some years will always be remembered as the first Finnish pioneer Sunday school teacher in South Porcupine serving faithfully for many years. Their children are Eileen and Jack now in Larder Lake Karlo their eldest son died in 1924.

## POLICE COURT

Acting Magistrate S. Platou heard nineteen minor breaches of the law in South Porcupine Police Court on Tuesday.
