ON THE SIDE

Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps' "Side" will lose a very valuable member of its personnel when Cadet Chief Gunner's Mate Roy G. Hobbs submits his resignation to C.O. Wm. Hitch. The Royal Canadian Navy has accepted Hobbs as Ordinary Seaman in the Recruiters Branch and is to report for duty very shortly. The Boards of Trade in Orillia, Barrie, North Bay and Cochrane have commenced on their annual membership drive and from the present reports it is expected that the membership will increase by at least twenty-five percent over last year's number.

A little warning to all local sportsmen who were successful in obtaining ducks or geese last fall. In Ontario it is illegal to have migratory game birds in one's possession (whether in one's own home, cold storage locker, or elsewhere) after March 31st. Eat up those birds and save the trouble of having the Mounted Police prosecute for illegal possession of game birds.

In many of the cases the owners of the birds claimed that they had forgotten that they still had some of their bag of ducks and geese in cold storage. The realization that they had broken the law appeared as an unpleasant surprise to nearly all of the lockers owners prosecuted.

Fire Proof Construction Recommended, Fire Hall

The Town of Timmins received the report of the Canadian Underwriters Association on the Fire Inspection of the town carried out on September 10th.

The recommendations suggested by the Underwriters were on the whole a repetition of what Fire Chief Stanley had made in his annual report.

The report recommended that a duplicate power system be installed to the pumphouse in case of a failure on one of the lines. Additional salvage covers, foam generators should be carried as fire fighting equipment.

The fire brigade should have an additional aerial company or a second ladder company. To meet this requirement it would be necessary to have 25 men on each shift under the present set up.

The fire hall, the present one which

should be of fire proof construction. For greater protection to residential area extra alarm boxes should be installed in the outlying districts of the town.

YMCA Junior Board Organizes
