TOWN OF TIMMINS BY-LAW NO.

BEING A BY-LAW to stop up a certain portion of the un-named street on the south boundary of Plan M-12 Cochrane and that portion of the un-named street between lots 14 and 22 and between lots 15 and 21 on said Plan M-12 Cochrane, and to permit the Corporation to lease or sell the portions of the streets so stopped up.

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation deem it desirable to close and stop up a certain portion of the un-named street on the south boundary of Plan M-12 Cochrane and that portion of the un-named street between lots 14 and 22 and between lots 15 and 21 on said Plan M-12 Cochrane.

AND WHEREAS the Council desires to have the right to lease or sell the portions of the streets so stopped up.

AND WHEREAS notice of the intention of the Council has been duly advertised as required by the Municipal Act and all persons who claim that their land would be prejudicially affected by this by-law and who applied to be heard have been heard by the Council.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED AS A BY-LAW OF THE TOWN OF TIMMINS as follows:

1. There is hereby closed and stopped up that part of the un-named street on the south boundary of Plan M-12 Cochrane from the projection southerly of the East boundary of lot No. 1, according to Plan M-12 Cochrane, westerly to the west boundary of the said Plan M-12 Cochrane.

2. There is hereby closed and stopped up that portion of the un-named street between lots 14 and 22 and between lots 15 and 21 on Plan M-12 Cochrane.

3. The Corporation may lease or sell the portions of the un-named streets so closed and stopped up.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that any person who claims that their land will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard will be heard by the Council, in person or by his Counsel, Solicitor or Agent at a time to be fixed therefor upon the application to be heard.

DALE CARNEGIE Author of "How to Win Friends and Influence People"

N. W. Lieberman of Brooklyn, N. Y., thinks I am wrong when I assert that one should never say, "No, you're wrong." He thinks there are times when a man should be told definitely that he is wrong. Well, note that I didn't say you must always agree with a man, though I did say not to say "No, you're wrong." It is the phrasing that is important. If you are tactful, careful in your manner, you can say practically anything to a man without offending or even ruffling him. Dr. Lieberman says—and so am I sure that you will agree with him, as I do—that there is an art in saying no, and this art is based on the oldest law of human relationships—re-spect or the other fellow. But let's let Dr. Lieberman tell his own version: "When someone comes to me with an idea," says Dr. Lieberman, "I ask him to spell it, and as soon as possible I agree with some minor point of his proposition. Then I ask him to come back after a few days or a week, when we both will have had time to think over the matter. If, when he re-turns, my answer is still no, I say no, but I give reasons for my conclusion, and I attempt to raise his own self-esteem by suggesting a substitute idea.

Cookies and small cakes stay fresher if you add one teaspoon of jam or jelly as a final ingredient before bak-ing. Marshmallows will not become hard as rocks if you keep them in a tightly-covered container while they are kept on a shelf. It's the air that dries them out. When unsliced bread dries out, wrap it in a clean, fresh towel which is dampened and place in a warm oven until the towel is dry. RECIPE OF THE WEEK Barbecued Chicken (Serves 6) 1 3/4 pound chicken; Paprika; 2 salt; 1 cup chili sauce; 1 onion min-ced; 2 tablespoon vinegar; 1 tablespoon water; 4 teaspoon pepper. Cut chicken into serving size pieces. Sprinkle with paprika. Brown chicken in skillet in hot shortening. Add remaining ingredients. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) for 1 hour or until chicken is tender when pierced with a fork. Baste frequently with sauce in pan. Dreams are rare among individuals past 65.

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
