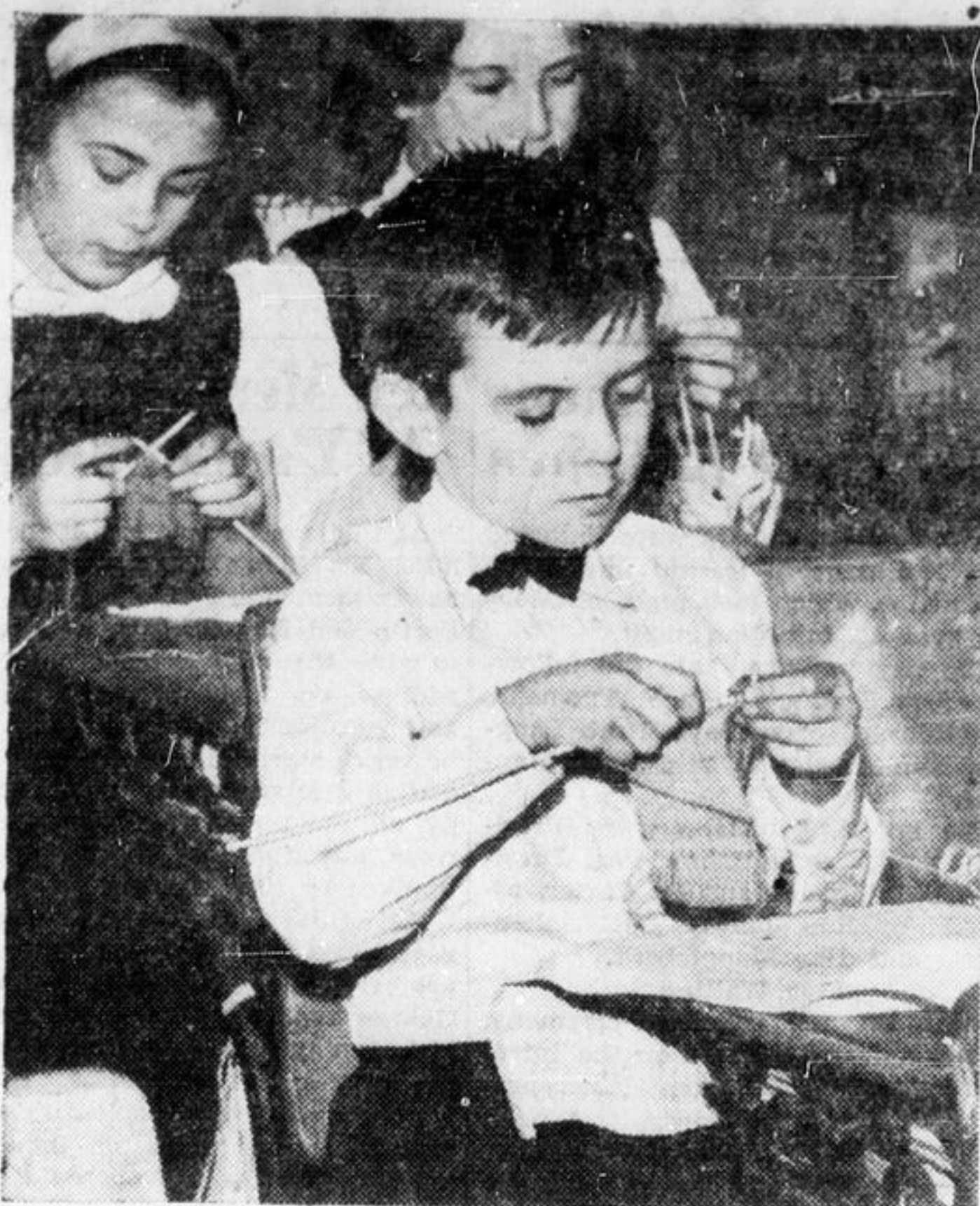
FANTAISE DU DETAIL — LA MODE
