So speaks Lee James in an illuminating article "How to Save on your Income Tax," in the April issue of National Home Monthly. Mr. James is right. And the government is wrong, I think, particularly with regard to sweepstakes.

The government says: Young man, work hard all week, all year, earn all the money you can earn, and we will tax you on it, all of it. But, young man, if you win \$1,000 in a sweep-stake, we will not tax that. Go on, boy, take a chance, a sporty chance, it won't cost much. You may win. And it is tax free.
