### His Heart Was Always Here

We said good-bye to him in his own church, before the altar where he so often ministered to us, knowing that his life of sacrifice and duty and love has now gained its just reward."

### Mrs. Maki Passes

Funeral services for Mrs. Henry K. Maki, nee Selma Katarina Latvala, who died suddenly of heart attack on Sunday, May 7th, were conducted at the South Porcupine Finnish Evangelical Lutheran Church on Thursday, May 9th, at 4 o'clock in the afternoon.

Hundreds of friends had gathered with the relatives to pay their last respects. The Reverend A. I. Heinonen of the United Finnish and Scandinavian Mission officiated, conducting

the services in Finnish. The Ladies' Choir of the South Porcupine Finnish Ev. Luth. Church sang two beautiful selections. Miss Leila Lyoma presided at the organ.

In his short funeral sermon, Rev. Heinonen, who married Mr. and Mrs. Maki only six years ago, referred to the beautiful Christian character of the late Mrs. Maki revealed in the Christian patience and fortitude of her last eighteen months of sickness, and her devotion to her home and husband.

The late Mrs. Maki was the daughter of Mr. Gabriel Latvala and his wife, Ann Katarina, nee Luoma. She was born at Alaherma, Vaasa Province, Finland, on the 28th of February, 1895. She came to Canada in 1927, and settled to live permanently in South Porcupine during 1936.

To mourn her loss she leaves her husband, Henry Maki at 3 Commercial Avenue, South Porcupine; two brothers, Vaino Latvala at Garson Mine, Ont.; Frans Latvala at Valtti, Finland; four sisters: Elli (Mrs. Neil Goden, Toronto); Amanda (Mrs. Chas. Nelson, Michigan); Hilma (Mrs. Leo Pistokoski); and Sanna Maria (Mrs. Isaac Mannisto), both in Finland.

Many beautiful floral tributes were received from friends all over Ontario and elsewhere. The pallbearers were Messrs. Vaino Latvala, John Harsila, Paavo Kangas, Antti Niemi, Pekka Jylha and Matti Rintanen. Interment took place in Tisdale Cemetery. Funeral arrangements were in charge of Hunkin's Funeral Home.

Mr. Ralph Ellis acted as chairman; principle guest speaker was Mr. O. E. Walli, principal of the Provincial Institute of Mines, Haileybury.

In addressing the students, he emphasized the necessity of working hard—"do it beyond the call of duty," he said. "Put more into everything than you expect to get out of it, and remember graduation from high school has only given you a foundation upon which to build."

The speaker stressed the importance of English as a subject; "the farther up the ladder the student ascends, the more important the mastery of the English language.

Donald Worth, Valetictorian, thanked the people of the community for the beautiful school building which his class had appreciated fully. He gave a summary of the year and the students. Of 100 who started in 1946, only 10 of the original number were graduating.

Principal Ellis congratulated members of the graduating class. He mentioned that the school although two years old had not yet lost its new look. The students had taken good care of it. The government has recognized the need for students to stay in school until 16 years of age; entrance class qualifications were not enough. Today, the stress was on the completion of at least the first two years of High School.

Students' Council honor awards were won by Florence Price and Alexander J. Austdal. They were awarded to these students who in the opinion of a committee of students and teachers, had contributed most of the welfare of the school. Florence Price won her "school letter" in 1948; was active on Girl's basket ball team, girl's volley ball team and various student committees; always being ready and willing to take on extra-curricular duties.

Alex. Austdal was president of Students Council; vice-president of Boys Athletic Society; member of boy's Rugby team for 5 years; member of boy's basketball team; an officer in School Cadet Corps; and assisted in School contest concert work, being also won his "school letter" in 1948.

He is now with the R.C.A.F. at Clinton. Florence Price is attending Normal School in North Bay.
