Scanning

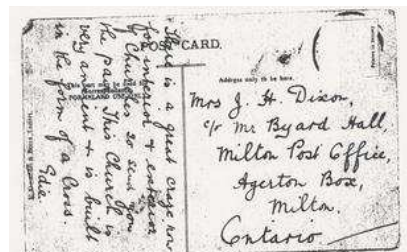

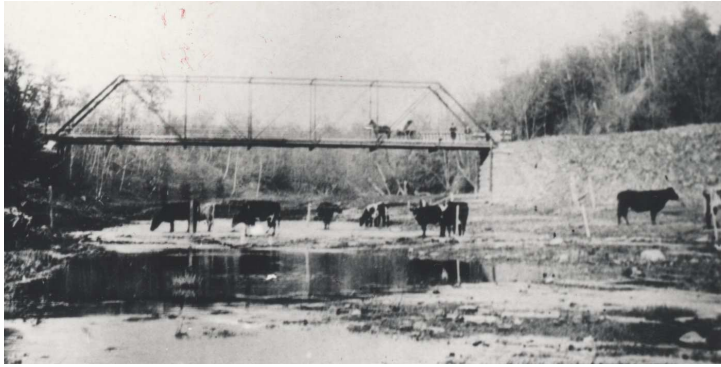
