Sherldan United Church
will celebrate its 100th
birthday Nov. 2.
The red brick church at
the intersection of South
Sheridan, Way and Sir Winstone Churchill Blvd, has survived despite rapid in destrialization in South South

Peel.
The church formerly served the community of Sheridan which was bisected by the Queen Elizabeth way and north and south service roads. All that remains of the community is the solid brick church which was built in 1869 for approximately \$1,400 on land donated by Ferris Lawrence.

The congregation is still going strong because it amalgamated with Park Roamalgamated with Park Ro-yal, Trinity United Church in 1963. When changing conditions reduced Sheri-dan's membership to 35 the congregations welded into Sheridan Park Royal United Church, Park Royal United Church drawing members from Park Royal subdivious, started in 1955 in temporary quarters.

The history of the church began in 1887 when Hev. Thomas Howard was stationed in the community. Services were held in an old frame school house before the church was built.

A trustee board was for-med which included Ferris Lawrence, William Clark, Richard Wilson, John Wilson, Peter Greenlans and George Long.

The first service under the oil lamps in 1859 was memorable. The building was dedicated by Rev. Sa-muel Philip, paster of the church. church.

The choir, led by Stephen Oughtred, who used a tuning fork, included Wiltuning fork, included William and Allen Oughtred, Mary Brewnridge, Misses Hhoda and Amella and William Falcener of Zien Church of Frogmore (a small hamlet on Dunda's Hwy, three miles west of Erindale) Mary and Hannah Gable and Mary, Edward and William Savage.

Amella Falconer played hymns on an organ loaned by Ryerson Kelly for the event. She was the gravimother of Edna Lawrence

of South Sheridan who also played the church

organ.
Miss Lawrence has watched the church go through most of the 20th century and has fond memories. She says many fine mini-sters preached at Sheridan including Rev. H. S. Lovering who stayed 13 years.

The anniversary will be commemorated by a stone cairn which will be erec-ted in front of the church. The interior of the building is being decorated for the event.

Anniversary services at 10:15 and 11 a.m. will be conducted by Rev. Donald Gillies, a former minister.

The minister of Sheridan Park Royal is Rev. Arnold Foster.

Over 150 invitations have been extended to former members.

Ellena Savage, a %-yearold woman who has attended Sheridan United all her life; will attend the service in a wheelchair. Hymns from the first service will be sung at the anniversary: '.
