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Introduction

This is a transcription of documents from Volumes 1, 16, 24, and 25, four of thirty-nine volumes of pay records and accounts of the Upper Canada Militia during the time of the War of 1812. In 2012, [Collections Canada](#) published digital copies of the microfilmed volumes on their website.

The transcribed documents included company and staff payrolls, muster rolls (Documents 237-242), and various Returns. Most documents had a stamped archival number but many documents appear to be missing from the set. Possibly these were documents that were no longer legible enough to microfilm. The documents were not always in numerical order on the microfilm. Documents were copied by hand during the war and there are multiple copies of some payrolls with different document numbers. Corrections and changes were made to the documents by the authors when this occurred. When there was more than one copy of the same document only one copy was transcribed here and any significant changes between copies were noted in the transcriber's comments, in square brackets.

The Document Index and the Document Transcripts have been sorted numerically by volumes and document numbers.

Some document titles included where the unit was stationed. Remarks on the documents may give insight as to what was happening in each company. The documents did not directly indicate that the men were at specific engagements with the Americans but the remarks may have suggested that they were. Examples of this type of remark beside a man's name were "wounded" and "taken prisoner". Officers were required to sign for receipt of their pay on separate payrolls. Most documents were certified as true and signed by an officer but not necessarily in the same year as the payroll period.

There were a number of problems encountered while transcribing these documents, the principal one being legibility. Spelling was phonetic at the time and it was not unusual to find a number of different spellings for many names.

A number of men served in more than one regiment during the war. This was particularly true of the men in the 5th Lincoln and 2nd York Militias. Men from the 2nd York served with men of the 5th Lincoln under 5th Lincoln officers on a number of occasions including the Capture of Fort Detroit. Both regiments appeared to have been mustering from some of the same townships but the transfer of men between regiments was probably facilitated when both regiments were stationed at Burlington Heights. There are examples of men who were transferred between companies within a regiment to even out the number of men in the companies and it appeared that the same was done between these two regiments.

Pay amounts and certification statements were not transcribed. Daily pay rates were:

The 5th Regiment of Lincoln Militia was drawn from men living in the townships of Ancaster, Barton, Binbrook, Glanford, and Saltfleet and the Grand River Tract. The townships later became part of the Wentworth County and were more recently incorporated into the City of Hamilton. The Grand River Tract became part of the Brant County.

Militia laws at times required all men from 16 to 60 to report for muster duty in the regiment in their area. The muster rolls therefore also served as a partial census of who was living in the area. However, a number of men received exemptions from service for various reasons. Over 700 men's names appeared in these payrolls from 1812 to 1814. Men did not always report for duty in the same company or even the same regiment.

Names may have been spelled differently on different payrolls and even on subsequent copies of the same payrolls. The assumption can usually be made that a given name belonged to only one man but there were a number of families with two or more generations of men with the same name. There were also a number of large families living in the area but all the men sharing that surname were not necessarily related.

A number of other problems had to be resolved in the transcription process because of the documents' deterioration, illegible hand writing, spelling errors, and

incomplete dates.

Finding payrolls for particular historical events can help clarify who took part in those events. The following were the engagements in which the 5th Lincoln took part and the related payroll documents:

No muster or payroll record has been found.

The transcriber has used these and other documents to compile an alphabetical muster roll. He is in the process of writing a biography for each of the men who served in this regiment and welcomes enquiries.

[A similar 2nd Flank muster was published in the Wentworth Historical Society, Volume 4, Wentworth Historical Society, Hamilton, 1905, under the heading of Militia Rolls of 1812 by Justus A. Griffin, page 111-112. The order of sergeants and privates was

different and there were 9 discrepancies in their names as well as numerous spelling variations. Henry Storms, John Green, Jacob Huffman, Stephen Beadle, Henry Young, John Aikman, Daniel McFee, John Land, Geriat Bonham and John Steward from the document above were replaced with Math. Lavrey, Josiah Bennet, Charles McIves, Henry Burkholder, Benjamin Phiter, Angus Aikman, David McAfee, Wm. Land, Levi Bonham, and Wm. Steward. Inclusion in this muster roll did not necessarily indicate that a particular man actually served actively in 1812. Payrolls were a more reliable source of service.]
