TOWNSITE TO EXPAND

It has been rumoured that our Townsite is due to expand. With this rumour in mind your reporter called on the company that will be responsible for the new additions to the Townsite. The program for 1947 consists of 75 housing units to be erected west of the present Townsite. The streets follow the gentle sloping natural contours of the ground in this area providing seven scenic avenues on which to build.

Houses of various design are to be erected this year. The architects have arranged the many plans in such a manner as to discourage monotony of house layout.

We can see a very busy building season ahead that will extend well into late fall. The burning question seems to be, "Will North American come through?" From the past record that this company has, we have no doubt that the houses will be completed on schedule.
