Verial to E. I.

black base: Season from July 1st to Oct 15th; limit; six per day; minimum length must be ten inches.

Maskinonge: Season from July 1st to October 1st; limit, 2 per day, 14 per season; minimum length must be thirty inches.

Trout, Brown, Rainbow and Aurora: Season from May 1st to September 15th; limit, five per day; minimum length must be seven inches.

Trout, Speckled: Season from May 1st to September 15th; limit, twenty per day; minimum length must be seven inches.

Pickerel and Pike: Season from May 15th to December 31st; limit six per day; minimum length must be thirteen inches for pickerel, no minimum for pike.

Lake Trout: No closed season on the Great Lakes; limit, per day - five.

(All nets require a permit or a license.)

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Efforts are being made to complete the fire-break around Terrace Bay before the fire season and the Woodlands Department feels they are doing all that is practical in the way of fire prevention outside Terrace Bay but a carelessly discarded match or cigarette could still do plenty of damage regardless of precautions. High winds soon put a small flame out of control and throw sparks and burning embers for considerable distances. Around Terrace Bay there is usually sand available for smothering small flames if water is not handy.

In the social activities of the Woodlands Department, the only item of note for this week is the arrival of Ole 'Flapjack' Swenson in our midst. The exact age of Ole is hard to determine but judging from his stories, and rumours about him, he is well past the jitterbug stage. It seems that he is distantly related to Oscar Wisselmunk III (on his great-great grandmother's side). This likely accounts for their similar characteristics.
