A year ago this month there was no such name as Terrace Bay. We were known as Black, Ontario.

During July '46 a teletype machine was installed to link us with LongLac's head office in Toronto..... Marvin Lemon reported for duty as an engineer to work in the Townsite on which construction work was just starting......in the middle of the month Ontario Construction poured the first basement for the first Terrace Bay house......North American Buildings were busy setting up their mill to produce prefabricated houses......Imperial Oil Co. were installing storage tanks and service pumps......work was being completed on the temporary water line for the Lower Camp and a water tower was being built.....plans were progressing for our present road out to the Trans-Canada Highway......the engineers and visitors drove back and forth morning and night, to and from the Schreiber Staff House......LongLac defeated Schreiber in a ball game 5-0...... the Millsite area was being cleared, stumps and vegitation were being removed prior to excavation for what is now the pulp storage building, the first permanent building constructed.

on July 31st, 1946, only 135 men were working at the project for all contractors and the LongLac organization.
