

ferred to an agreement which had been reached between the Coosa River Newsprint Company and the Kimberly-Clark Corp. of Neenah, Wisconsin, regarding a new \$30 million dollar pulp and paper mill to be built at CHILDERSBURG, Alabama. Plans call for a mill with a rated daily capacity of 350 tons of newsprint and 250 tons of bleached sulphate pulp.

In making the announcement, Edward L. Norton, president of Coosa River Newsprint Company, indicated that full operating responsibility would be assumed by Kimberly-Clark Corp. and would include all factors of design and construction of the new mill and its subsequent operation, including both production and sales.

To-day, Mr. Norton will arrive at Terrace Bay for a brief visit, accompanied by Birmingham, Alabama business associates including Donald Comer, President of Avondale Mills; Lieut-General John C. Persons, President of the First National Bank and Walter Bouldin, Barrister. In the party also is Fleming Newbold, President of the Washington Evening Star. Kimberly-Clark Corporation officials with the group are: Cola G, Parker, President; Ernst Mahler, Executive Vice-President; C. H. Sage, Vice-President and Arthur Wakeman, Asst. General Manager in charge of Kimberly-Clark expansion.

The entire group has just completed a visit to Kapuskasing, Ontario, where Spruce Falls Power and Paper Co. Ltd. and Kimberly-Clark Corp. of Canada Ltd. are located.
