With the exception of these 1-1/2 inch valves, the use of fire hydrants for water other than for fire purposes is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN.

Unauthorized personnel of any Company connected with the LongLac project observed tampering with fire hydrants will be dismissed.

As lives and property depend upon an adequate water supply in case of fire, dismissal from the job is not too drastic action for those who tamper with fire prevention equipment as important as fire hydrants.
