Those 3 runs were the only ones scored in the entire game which ended in the favour of the Fraser-Brace team 3-0.

Despite the loss of the game and the series the Hydro Kilowatts deserve a let of credit. "Red" Davis, Hydro pitcher and captain, sparked the team time and again throughout the semi-finals and finals.
