Diamond drilling crews were hard at work boring test holes.....the Snow-mobile arrived on the job......2 - 16x24 foot buildings on skids were being built in the Lower Camp near the present Hospital - the first buildings of the LongLac project. The only typewriter on the job had to be sent to Port Arthur for repairs and Jim Isbester, engineer in charge at the time, was writing his reports longhand. Crews and staff travelled back and forth from the Staff House in Schreiber.

At the Millsite, mill clearing was 90% complete......work continued on the south wall of the Pulp Storage Bldg. In the Townsite 8 houses had been erected......

34 basements were complete......clearing had been completed on all streets approved.
