REV. FATHER JAMES DELANEY APPOINTED TO ST. MARTIN'S PARISH

Appointed by Bishop Dignan to St. Martin's Parish as its first parish priest is Rev. Father James Delaney, who celebrated his first Mass at Terrace Bay on Sunday, September 6th.

Father Delaney was born at Chapleau, Ontario, where his father was a C.P.R. trainman. Father Delaney received his primary and secondary education at North Bay, following which he attended college at Kitchener, Montreal and London. He was ordained as a priest in 1940. His first appointment was to Sturgeon Falls, Ontario, from which he was transferred to Temagami, where he was stationed for 4½ years, during which much of his time was spent on the Indian Reserve at Bear Island. Prior to his appointment to Terrace Bay, Father Delaney was located at Wawa.

As Father Delaney assumes his responsibilities as parish priest for St. Martin's Parish, we extend to him a sincere welcome on behalf of the community of Terrace Bay.
