18 Months Ago At Terrace Bay

Diamond drill crews continued work in various sections of the project. Only 2 temporary buildings had been erected in the entire project and these were used as camps by some 15 persons who were living "on the job". Visitors to the project were: H.S. Craig (Long Lac's Manager); C.W. Nelson and W.L. Thornton Jr. of Kimberly Clark Corp. Neenah, Wisconsin. Stan Hodgkiss (Long Lac) then with Charles Warnock Co., returned from a visit to Toronto.

12 months Ago at Terrace Bay

Down at Intake Bay, on Lake Superior, information was being gathered related to the probable location of the water intake pipe.

In the Townsite the 1946 house building program was gaining momentum. Excavation had been completed for all 75 houses. Basements had been poured for 64 and 17 houses had been erected.

The Lower Camp was really taking shape. Camps (although filled to capacity) had been constructed to house and feed the 357 men who were employed throughout the project. Material was flowing in at such a rate that more than 1/3rd of the entire labour force was required to handle it.....Work on the temporary water line under the C.P.R. track had been completed....The building which was to house a branch of the Imperial Bank of Canada was nearly finished.

In the Upper Camp, work on the only permanent building under construction continued as the Pulp Storage building began to shape up.....Excavation for the foundation of the boiler house progressed and an area was cleared for lumber storage at the Millsite.
