TERRACE BAY FISH AND GAME ASSOCIATION HOLDS FALL BANQUET

The first Annual Fall Banquet of the Terrace Bay

Fish and Game Association was held in the Main Dining Room at the Lower Camp last Wednesday, September 24th, with some 175 persons in attendance.

Following a deliciously cooked Fresh Lake Superior Trout dinner, with all the trimmings, served by Dominion Catering Company, the banquet group (which included the ladies) too heartily enjoyed a sing-song led by Wilf Dorris with Fred Soughton at the piano.

Due to the illness of President Doug. Johnson, Vice-President Ed. Cavanaugh very capably acted as Chairman.

A delegation from Fort William and Port Arthur representing the parent organization, Thunder Bay District Fish and Game Association, included the following: Mr. & Mrs. Harvey Johnson, Reg. Heading the Lakehead delegation was John E. Fryer, President of the Thunder Bay District Association. Mr. Fryer announced that arrangements were being completed for a meeting of representatives of all fish and game groups in the Thunder Bay District, for the purpose of developing a federation. Individual organizations would retain their autonomy under the federation, but in matters of national, provincial and district interest, the federation would be in a position to act for all groups.

Guest speaker of the evening was Randolph L. Peterson, Royal Ontario Museum of Zoology, who is in charge of the moose survey being conducted at the present time on St. Ignace Island which is located off the north shore of Lake Superior between Rossport and Nipigon.

Mr. Peterson stated that the decline in the moose population of Ontario had been the reason for the study which had started last year in Algonquin Park and had moved to St. Ignace early this spring.

The speaker stated that he was impressed with the possibilities and opportunities of the Terrace Bay organization to properly utilize, perpetuate and conserve the wild life of the district. During his talk, Mr. Peterson utilized a number of 35 m.m. Kodachrome pictures of moose and other wild life. The guest speaker was thanked by Ted Jones, Jr.
