LARGEST CIRCULATION IN TERRACE BAY

October 8, 1947.

This entire week of October 5th to 11th was set aside by President Truman as Fire Prevention Week throughout the United States and in Canada the Week will be observed for the same purpose by proclamation of the Governor General.

Fire Prevention Week serves particularly in two ways.

First, it acquaints the general public with statistics related to loss

of life, property loss and devastation caused by fire.

Second, through organizations such as the National Fire Protection Association, constructive suggestions are made regarding common sense methods of fire prevention.

We should all heed the lessons to be learned from such facts as:

1. Caroless smokers cause more than 100,000 fires every year in the U.S.A.

LESSON: KEEP FIRE RESISTANT ASH TRAYS HANDY AND DON'T SMOKE IN BED.

2. Children with matches caused 26,000 fires last year in the U.S.A.

LESSON: KEEP MATCHES OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN.

3. Inflammable cleaning fluids caused 8,000 fires in homes last year in the U.S.A.

LESSON: USE NON-INFLAMMABLE FLUIDS IN THE HOME OR CAMP BUILDING OR SEND CLOTHES TO A COMMERCIAL CLEANER.

Perhaps many of us will be inclined to take the attitude: "We've heard all about fire prevention before". Proof of the fact that we have not learned our lessons well, however, is indicated by such Canadian statistics as 408 lives lost in 1946 as against 391 in 1945 while property loss in 1946 increased 7½ million over the previous year to \$49,500,000. Throughout Canada 55,400 fires were reported.

Next week and every week, let us resolve to remember the lessons which we should learn during Fire Prevention Week.
