## FROM THE TERRACE BAY RECORDS

The entire Terrace Bay locality was nothing but a wooded area where surveys were being made relative to the selection of a site of the present project.

18 Months Ago

In addition to 2 original camp buildings, 5
additional portable buildings had been erected.

Dishes, cutlery, cooking utinsels, beds and bedding were being ordered sufficient for a 100-man camp. Dining room tables and benches were being constructed "on the spot" by our carpenters.

A stable had been erected and one team of horses had arrived from the Woodlands Dept. at LongLac Ontario, after a 7 hour truck ride.

A three-ton army truck was due to arrive. Diamond drilling continued as a means of probing soil conditions.

In the Townsite 38 houses had been erected and finishing carpenters were busy completing the first half dozen. Three houses had received their enterior pine coat of paint. The Power House in Townsite was ready for use and a Motor grader had been placed in use on the roads.

At the Millsite, all steel for Pulp Storage building had been erected by Canada Bridge and the steel gang had left Terrace Bay. Framing of the building had begun. The survey of the Blackbird Creek sewer line continued.

At Intake Bay, on Lake Superior, the location of the pumphouse had been decided.

Throughout the project, approximately 400 persons

were at work.
