

2 Years Ago

The present site for the LongLac project was selected following surveys of a number of possible locations in this area.

18 Months Ago With less than 30 persons on the payroll, diamond drilling continued as a major operation although 7 buildings had been erected in the Lower Camp area...The staff group travelled back and forth from the Staff Camp in Schreiber.

12 Months Ago Approximately 400 people were engaged at Terrace Bay as things really began to hum.

In the Townsite, 44 houses had been erected --one house was completed except for minor details...Sewers and water mains were progressing satisfactorily.... A Fire Chief reported for duty and immediately undertook an extensive fire prevention program.

At the Millsite the Pulp Storage Building had been erected and framing was underway...Boiler house footings and piers were in place. The first Church Service was conducted by Rev. A.F. Lavender of Schreiber....Movies were shown for the first time in the project.
