LONGLAC EMPLOYEES BUY CANADA SAVINGS BONDS

During the recent campaign a total of 67 persons took advantage of buying Canada Savings Bonds offered for sale through representatives in each Department of the LongLac organization at Terrace Bay.

Of these, 56 were purchasers on the Payroll Savings Plan, buying a total of \$13,250, while 11 persons bought for cash to a total of \$3,200. Total sales were, therefore, \$16,450.

On an average payroll of 190 LongLac employees this would be equivalent to a purchase to the value of \$86.60 per employee, a record of which we are justly proud.
