This By-Law provides for applications for Taxi Licenses to be received at the Provincial Police Office; License fees are \$25.00 for the first car and \$15.00 for each additional car; Drivers' License fees, \$5.00 each.

Anyone who commits a breach of any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a fine not exceeding \$50.00, (exclusive of interest and costs)."
