A Year Ago This Month

The general contractors, Fraser Brace Engineering Co. (Ontario) Ltd., arrived at Terrace Bay and began immediately the construction of a 1000-man camp at the millsite area in which to house men for mill construction. At the time the only permanent building at the millsite was the pulp storage building..... The Hydro power line connecting Terrace Bay with Cameron Falls had been completed to the substation at the millsite. In the Lower Camp - the nerve centre of the LongLac project - total camp facilities provided for slightly over 400 men. Included also in the area were administration offices, bank, post office, warehouse, recreation building and miscellaneous workshops. In the townsite 15 houses were tenant occupied as other families prepared to move in as rapidly as additional houses were completed. School children were being transported daily to and from school at Schreiber.
