FIRST BUILDING AT TERRACE BAY STARTED TWO YEARS AGO TO-DAY

It's just two years ago to-day (March 4, 1946) that a start was made on the first temporary building of this great Terrace Bay project. Under the supervision of our good friend Malcolm Spidell, a handful of men started to build what was then called the cookery. The name Terrace Bay, of course, was not in use. The area was known as Black Siding, a flagstop on the main transcontinental line of the C. P. R.
